PEACH SPRINGS — Not many toddlers use learning materials, especially ones whom doctors said would never learn how to talk, but for two-year-old Anya, her family and First Things First were major factors in her learning, here in a weekly community meeting discussing doctors' expectations that the youngster would never be able to do.

Ann Down of Peach Springs said, "First Things First has connected, statewide organizations that focus early education and health programs to help kids be successful once they enter kindergarten. Decisions about how those funds are spent are made by local residents, elected by community volunteers."
