WHAT IS THE INTENT OF THIS FUNDING OPPORTUNITY?

The White Mountain Apache Tribe Regional Partnership Council (RPC) has identified the need for regional implementation of the following strategies:

- Expand or establish new community-based family education programs that support parents and caregivers in their ability to promote their children's optimal development and health.
- Support, enhance and implement programs and services that provide parents and caregivers access to information, resources and high-quality social support.

The White Mountain Apache Tribe Regional Partnership Council serves, and applications submitted in response to this RFGA must serve, any child ages birth through five residing within the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.. The intended target population of this funding opportunity is families with children birth through age five. Programs must engage

families at all levels. Priority may be given to targeted populations based upon regional needs such as low income families, single parents, teen parents, first time parents, relatives raising children, or underserved geographic areas.

WHAT IS THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF FUNDING AVAILABLE?

Approximately \$159,000 is available in this Request for Grant Application. Contract renewal will be contingent upon satisfactory contract performance, evaluation and availability of funds.

The anticipated contract period for any resultant grant will be July 1, 2009 to June 30, 2010.

WHAT IS THE INTENT OF THIS FUNDING OPPORTUNITY?

The First Things First White Mountain Apache Tribe Regional Partnership Council (RPC) has identified the need for regional implementation of the programs that expand the capacity of early language and literacy programs (particularly in the child's native language) to provide supports and services to young children and their families.

The White Mountain Apache Tribe Regional Partnership Council serves, and applications submitted in response to this RFGA must serve any child birth through age five and their family, residing within the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The White Mountain Apache Tribe RPC intends to provide funding to programs implementing the following activities:

- Supply children with materials such as books, crayons, drawing pads, pencils, etc., to ensure that children have the opportunity to read and write in their natural settings
- Provide resources to families that will enable them to engage their child with books and print media while in the home or other relative care settings
- Begin or expand collaboration with existing literacy programs on the Reservation
- Promote increased opportunities for parents interacting with their children (e.g. reading circles or story times, conferences or trainings for family or caregivers)

WHAT IS THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF FUNDING AVAILABLE?

Approximately \$100,000 is available in this Request for Grant Application. Contract renewal will be contingent upon satisfactory contract performance, evaluation and availability of funds.

The anticipated contract period for any resultant grant will be July 1, 2009 to June 30, 2010.

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
