Call to Order

The regular meeting of the First Things First—Navajo/Apache Regional Partnership Council was held on Wednesday, April 13, 2011, at 3:00 p.m., at Northland Pioneer College, 2251 North Navajo Boulevard, Nhizoni Learning Center Room 142, Holbrook, Arizona 86025.

Community Outreach Report

Community Outreach Coordinator Michelle Pansulla presented her monthly report and then presented an overview of the Community Outreach Forum held on April 6, 2011 in Show Low, Arizona. After discussion, staff was directed to create a workgroup to more thoroughly discuss, plan, and articulate the implementation plan for this strategy. Discussion and Possible Approval of Needs and Assets Vendor for 2012 Navajo/Apache Regional Partnership Council Needs and Assets Report

Regional Director Dobler-Allen reviewed the list of potential vendors for the next Needs and Assets Report for the Navajo/Apache Region. Regional Director Dobler-Allen noted that the timeline will allow for a full year of research and the final report will be presented to the Regional Council in August 2012. After discussion, Member Downs moved to follow the Regional Director's recommendation to have Applied Survey Research do the Needs and Assets Report during Fiscal Year 2012. Vice Chair Meyer seconded; the motion passed.

Discussion and Possible Approval of Process and Timeline to Identify Additional Needs and Assets Data Point Collection and Greater Level of Analysis Desired for the 2012 Regional Needs and Assets Report

Regional Director Dobler-Allen reminded the members that the Regional Council has allocated \$25,000 in additional funds for this next report, to provide additional funding for a more in-depth report. After discussion, Chair Barela directed staff to create a timeline for the collection of Regional Council Member input into the list of data points to be collected and to then begin contracting and scope of work conversations with Applied Survey Research.

Chair Barela moved back to Agenda Item #9.
