Legislative Update

Ballot signatures were due on Wednesday, May 26 to qualify for the Primary Election Ballot. <http://www.azsos.gov/election/2010/Primary/FullListing.htm> For many districts, the Primary Election determines the winner and determines who will serve in many legislative districts. Although there is always at least one surprise race, in Legislative Districts - both the House and the Senate – 2 and 13 will be determined in the Primary Election, August 24. In the Senate - Legislative District 16 and 19; and in the House – Legislative District 3 will also be determined in the Primary Election. For the Senate – candidates are running unopposed for the State Senate in Legislative Districts 20, 21, 22, 27, 28, and 29; and in Legislative District 14 both in House race and the Senate race candidates are unopposed.

The competitive districts for the 2011-2012 legislative session are Legislative District 5 - House and Senate; Legislative District 10 – House and Senate; Legislative District 17 - House and Senate; Legislative District 23 – House and Senate; and Legislative District 26 – House and Senate. The other districts are considered “safe” – at least a 10,000 difference in registered voters of the two major political parties and/or a high propensity for voters to support a specific major party. It will potentially take the General Election in November to determine the outcome of the remainder of the district elections and the leadership in both the House and the Senate. Attached is the list of candidates that are slated to run for election in the Primary Election held, August 24, 2010 with Early voting beginning July 29. (The General Election is November 2, with Early Voting starting October 7.) Also attached is a list of individuals running for state-wide office and for federal representation in the House (8 seats) and in the Senate (1 seat up for election).

Each county recorder’s office has a Permanent Early Voting List (PEVL). To automatically get on this list one can:
