**Welcome/Call to Order**

The Regular Meeting of the First Things First San Carlos Apache Regional Partnership Council was held on Tuesday, May 14, 2013 at the San Carlos Apache Telecommunications Utility, Inc. Conference Room, San Carlos Avenue, Peridot, Arizona 85542.

Chair Rodriguez called the meeting to order at approximately 1:08 p.m.

**Call to the Public**

Chair Rodriguez announced the Call to the Public. There was no response.

**Declarations of Conflict of Interest**

Chair Rodriguez requested Regional Council members review the agenda items and declare any possible Conflicts of Interest at this time.

Member Noline declared a Conflict of Interest with agenda item 5a. She is affiliated with an organization that may be involved with the agenda item. As a result, she recused herself from any discussion and voting related to the agenda item.

Member Howard declared a Conflict of Interest with agenda items 5a, 5b and 5d. She is affiliated with an organization that may be involved with the agenda items. As a result, she recused herself from any discussion and voting related to the agenda item.

Member Patiño declared a Conflict of Interest with agenda item 5d. He is affiliated with an organization that may be involved with the agenda item. As a result, he recused himself from any discussion and voting related to the agenda item.

**Meeting Minutes**

A motion was made by Member Howard to approve the April 9, 2013 minutes as presented, seconded by Member Noline. Motion carried 7-0.

**SFY2014 Grantee Renewals**

**A. Family, Friend and Neighbor**

Chair Rodriguez informed the Regional Council that there are two Regional Council Members with a Conflict of Interest with this agenda item and tabled the agenda item due to a loss of quorum.

#### B. Native Language Preservation

Chair Rodriguez informed the Regional Council that there is a Regional Council Member with a Conflict of Interest with this agenda item. Chair Rodriguez addressed Ms. Beatty to discuss the grantee renewal. Ms. Beatty informed the Regional Council that the San Carlos Apache Tribe is the grantee for the strategy and is recommended for renewal. The grantee will be submitting the draft language curriculum to the San Carlos Apache Tribal Council for approval in FY2014.

A motion was made by Member Antonio to renew the grantee for SYF2014, seconded by Member Noline. Motion carried 6-0-1.

#### C. Curriculum Development – Parent Education

Ms. Beatty reminded the Regional Council that the San Carlos Apache Tribe Social Services Department is the grantee for the strategy. The grantee was recommended for renewal by staff with a contract amount of \$46,530 for SFY2014. No data was presented for the grantee, only narrative reports are available. The draft parent education curriculum will be complete before SFY2014.

A motion was made by Member Noline to renew the Curriculum Development – Parent Education grantee for SFY2014, seconded by Member Howard. Motion carried 7-0.

#### D. Developmental and Sensory Screening

Chair Rodriguez informed the Regional Council that there are two Regional Council Members with a Conflict of Interest with this agenda item and tabled the agenda item due to a loss of quorum.

#### E. Nutrition/Obesity/Physical Activity

Ms. Beatty reminded the Regional Council that the United Way of Tucson and Southern Arizona has a 9 month contract for SFY2013. The grantee was recommended for renewal by staff with a contract amount of \$150,000. The grantee had difficulty staffing the strategy, but staff has been hired and there are no foreseeable complications implementing the program.

A motion was made by Member Patiño to approve the Nutrition/Obesity/Physical Activity grantee for SFY2014, seconded by Vice Chair Poncho. Motion carried 7-0.

#### F. Food Security

Ms. Beatty reminded the Regional Council that the San Carlos Apache Tribe Social Services Department is the grantee for the strategy. Data reports for quarter one and two show no food boxes delivered of the 259 targeted boxes. Staff is recommending this grantee for renewal due to the plan presented by the grantee at the mid-year check-in.

A motion was made by Member Patiño to approve the Food Security grantee for SFY2014, seconded by Vice Chair Poncho. Motion carried 7-0.

#### G. Parent Outreach and Awareness

Ms. Beatty reminded the Regional Council that the Gila County Library District is the grantee for the strategy. Staff is recommending this grantee for renewal in SFY2014 with a contract amount of \$69,884.

A motion was made by Member Noline to renew the Parent Outreach and Awareness strategy grantee for SFY2014, seconded by Member Patiño. Motion carried 7-0.

#### **CEO Report and Update**

Chair Rodriguez gave the floor to Rhian Evans Allvin, First Things First Chief Executive Officer. Ms. Allvin gave a brief update of the statewide evaluation plan and Quality First rating scale.

Member Howard left the meeting at 1:55 p.m.

#### **SFY2014 Funding Mechanism**

##### A. Parent Education – Community Based Training

Ms. Beatty informed the Regional Council that no responses to the Parent Education – Community Based Training RFGA were received. The San Carlos Apache Tribe Education Committee is aware of no responses and will support the Regional Council's decision on how to move forward. The Regional Council was given the options to release another RFGA or a government to government agreement with Tribal or non-Tribal entity. Ms. Beatty informed there is a possibility to partner with the Wellness

Center's Teen Mom program or the San Carlos Unified School District. She informed the Regional Council that any RFGA or agreement will be for a portion of SFY2014.

A motion was made by Member Noline to research appropriate entities and pursue a government to government agreement, seconded by Vice Chair Poncho. Motion carried 6-0.

#### **SFY2013 Grantee Financial Report**

Ms. Beatty gave a brief update of SFY2013 grantee financial information. The Regional Council was informed that the Curriculum Development – Parent Education, Food Security, Native Language Preservation and Parent Outreach and Awareness grantees are all being monitored by First Things First's Finance Department due to low expenditure amounts.

#### **Regional Director's Report**

Ms. Beatty informed the Regional Council that no applications for the three vacant seats on the Regional Council have been received. Ms. Beatty also provided a brief summary of the Week of the Young Child events held April 14 – 20, 2013 sponsored by the San Carlos Apache Early Childhood Development and Health Collaborative. The Regional Council was informed of the registration process for the First Things First Summit being held August 25 – 27, 2013.

#### **System Building**

Ms. Beatty led the Regional Council in discussion regarding the early childhood system in the San Carlos Apache region. The Regional Council Members provided feedback on the current system components, concerns and their goals for the system in the future.

#### **General Discussion Regional Partnership Council Members/Staff**

Chair Rodriguez opened the floor for general discussion. No Regional Council members or staff responded.

**SFY2014 Grantee Renewals**

**A. Family, Friend and Neighbor**

Chair Rodriguez stated three present council members declared a Conflict of Interest with the Family, Friend and Neighbor strategy and with three council member seat vacancies she invoked the Rule of Impossibility. The Rule of Impossibility states that members can act upon making their Conflicts of Interest known in the official agency record. The Regional Council proceeded with a vote under the Rule of Impossibility.

LaToya Beatty, Regional Director, informed the Regional Council that for SFY2014 the Family, Friend and Neighbor grantee is proposing \$54,000 to serve ten home care providers. The grantee will not meet the SFY2013 target service numbers due to low recruitment into the program. Staff is recommending renewal of this grant.

A motion was made by Member Patiño to renew the Family, Friend and Neighbor grant, seconded by Vice Chair Poncho. Motion carried 8-0 by a roll call vote.

**B. Developmental and Sensory Screening**

Chair Rodriguez stated that three present members declared a Conflict of Interest with the Developmental and Sensory Screening strategy and with three council member seat vacancies she invoked the Rule of Impossibility. The Rule of Impossibility states that members can act, upon making their Conflicts of Interest known in the official agency record. The Regional Council proceeded with a vote under the Rule of Impossibility.

Ms. Beatty informed the Regional Council that for FY2014 the Developmental and Sensory Screening grantee is proposing \$96,645 to provide 120 developmental and sensory screenings. The grantee will not meet the target service numbers for SFY2013 due to many complications. Staff has been reassured that these issues have been resolved and the grantee will reach as close as possible to the target service numbers by the end of SFY2013. Staff is recommending renewal of this grant.

A motion was made by Vice Chair Poncho to renew the Developmental and Sensory Screening grant, seconded by Member Noline. Motion carried 8-0 by a roll call vote.

**Successes:** The community liaison continues to support and provide service to 5 year old Apache speaking boy. Home visits are conducted weekly and include: one-on-one conversations; lesson plans for names of animal, fruits, and nature; storytelling of “Brown Bear, Brown Bear” translated into Apache and English.

Spring Break Youth Camp in Bylas for Pre K to first grade. The Tribe’s Wellness Center sponsored the youth camp and our department presented the Language Preservation program as well as reaching out the 3 to 5 year olds. Topics included: “How important the Apache language is”; and singing “Old McDonald” and “Head, Shoulder, Knees and Toes.”

Professional development trainings have continued with the Head Start and Apache Kid Child Care Centers. The training included: one-on-one with teachers/providers; lesson plan introductions, discussions and hands-on activities; how to engage in positive relationships and interactions with one another; and an assessment of the teachers and early child care providers knowledge of various Apache words learned. The assessment was able to target “how many teachers and providers were able to capture and memorize the words they have learned throughout the months.” Participants strengthened and enhanced their knowledge of literacy and history of the Apache Language and Culture.

**Staffing:** A consultant was hired and comes with twenty plus years of experience in teaching the Apache language. The Consultant has taught in an immersion program, developed and designed Apache curriculum for grades K-12, assisted in a Natural Resource Camp, and reads and writes in Apache.

The secretary position is vacant again as of April 22<sup>nd</sup>.

**Challenges:** Retention of administrative assistant. It is intended to hire an individual who can work with Native Americans and is willing to learn, have dedicated for the position and is energetic in working with children. Cancellation of professional development trainings due to non-participation.

**Collaboration and Communication:** San Carlos Older Adult Center and Elders Mentors programs are available to assist our program in providing us with guidance in teaching the Apache language. They are our mentors and have much experience of the Apache language. The Elders Advisors Committee provides discussions regarding what is best and important in learning the Apache language.” The San Carlos Apache Tribe’s Wellness Center, Diabetes Prevention Program and Boys and Girls Club have requested presentations from our department.

An in-service training was held at the Apache Gold Casino in February. Presenters from the White Mountain Apache Tribe Head Start and San Carlos Unified School District shared their insight of the importance of teaching the Apache language.

**Support/Additional Information:** First and foremost, we enjoy reading the San Carlos Apache Early Childhood Development and Health Collaborative Newsletter. It provides the spotlight of what the other programs are doing and it provides a little more information about the program and gives parent resources.

Thank you to Regional Director, LaToya Beatty, for all her assistance, and Fiscal Specialist, Maria Soto, for assisting in our grant renewal. Thank you ladies for responding to our requests and making things possible for our program!

More training is needed for all early childhood educators in our region. We are heading in the right direction with our goal in preserving our Apache language. It has been a great year so far and we received some good remarks from the teachers and providers that the children are learning the basic words of the Apache language.

**Successes:** Direct contact and communication has been made with center directors and lead staff at all Child Care Centers and Head Start Centers regarding updates about the Family Book Bag and upcoming trainings. All staff implementing the Family Book Bag has the United Way of Tucson and Southern Arizona’s Program Managers contact information for technical support if needed.

Child care providers who participated in the Family Book Bag Program Training in January received the following: hands-on training of how to create lessons from the books they will receive that support nutrition and physical activity; how to pull the nutrition and physical activity messages from the titles, once mastered, they took the books and transformed them into enrichment activities they felt were appropriate for the children they care for.

The San Carlos communities that are early childhood professionals or literacy professionals attended a Focus Group during the Month of March. The Focus group discussed modification tips that would assist in making United Way of Tucson and Southern Arizona’s Literacy Guide friendlier to the families living in the region.

**Staffing:** Hiring an instructional aid too longer than anticipated and caused a delay in program services. On March 25<sup>th</sup> Juan Arias was hired for this position. He has a Bachelor’s of Science in Community Health and experience working with preschoolers and parents in California.

**Challenges:** Recruiting more in-home based child care sites has been challenging and with the instructional specialist hired more opportunities to make connections with the community and attend community events will be made.

**Collaboration and Communication:** Collaboration with Apache Kid Child Care Director who is recruiting home care providers for her Family, Friend, and Neighbor care program has shown the same difficulty with recruiting home providers. However, she is actively spreading the word about our up and coming trainings and program opportunities. Other partners include: Head Start and San Carlos Group Home.

**Support/Additional Information:** FTF staff assistance is needed to locate tribal photo release forms. We are looking for replacement photos of local children ages 0-5 years being active and reading books. These photos upon approval will be used in the revised copy of our Literacy Guides. The instructional specialist is working on developing a gardening training using the Grow it, Try it, Like it! Curriculum developed by USDA’s Team Nutrition.

**Successes:** Attending community functions and meeting families with 0-5 age group children; talking about training on nutrition and receiving a bag of groceries; this was effective and accepted by families.

Pastor Dan Picciuto with Church of Jesus Christ is still helping us give bags of food to families who are in need; 10 families per month.

**Staffing:** Not enough monies to hire a person who can assist with this project; working with new dietician at Indian Health Service – Stacey Gyniece; very cooperative and helpful.

**Challenges:** Successful in recruiting families and educating them on healthy foods for health children. The Globe Food Bank has stopped helping to give food to San Carlos Apache Reservation residents and advised us to work with the Tribe’s Food Distribution Program that distributes commodity foods.

**Collaboration and Communication:** Current collaboration is alright, seems like we’re competing for clients; everyone is out there grabbing families for child education; collaboration is constant; selling the pitch of food security. Going good.

**Support/Additional Information:** Patience, Finance Department is slowly working out details for next purchase.

**Successes:** As of April 2013 there are 406 children registered for the Imagination Library Program with 32 graduates (children who have reached their fifth birthday) bringing the total children reached on the San Carlos Apache Reservation to four hundred thirty-eight. On March 7<sup>th</sup>, the Payson Public Library hosted a Brain Box Training presented by Pamela Webb, Director of Training, at New Directions Institute for Infant Brain Development. Emma Victor, San Carlos Librarian, and Stephanie Dean, Community Liaison, were able to attend this eight hour training.

**Staffing:** Nothing to report at this time.

**Challenges:** Children who are not listed on the list of “people approved to get mail at this address” must be added to the list kept at the post office. Books cannot be forwarded to new addresses as they are mailed on a non-profit status. The community liaison will attempt to verify addresses.

**Collaboration and Communication:** During the last four years children in the Bylas area have been being registered by the Graham/Safford Library. During the month of March, 2013, arrangements were made to start transferring sixty children into the San Carlos Apache Reservation registrations at Imagination Library. This process will be completed early in April. The Graham/Safford will continue to register children in this area and will transfer the information to the Gila County Library District for inclusion in the San Carlos Reservation Imagination Library Program.

**Support/Additional Information:** LaToya Beatty has been keeping the District apprised of community events and FTF Collaborative meetings. During the months of April and May the Gila County Library District will be conducting a parent satisfaction survey. The District will be mailing a letter to each family of the children enrolled in the program. The letter will contain a self-addressed stamped postcard that will need to be filled out and mailed back to the District. Results of the survey will be available in the final quarterly report for this fiscal year.

**Staffing:** Nothing to report at this time.

**Challenges:** With such a massive topic, there is not enough time to most fully and thoughtfully develop this curriculum. This project will continue into next fiscal year.

**Collaboration and Communication:** Ongoing interviews have been taking place regarding traditional Apache parenting with elders from the San Carlos Apache Tribe, the White Mountain Apache Tribe, the Tonto Apache Tribe, and the Yavapai-Apache Nation.

**Support/Additional Information:** Venturing into unthreaded territory regarding development of curriculum for Apache parents is a new concept for everyone involved.
