#### **Statewide Strategy Update**

- 1. Quality First- The first round of participants have been selected. Coaches have been making contact with centers and completing the enrollment paperwork. Assessment grantees have been completing the ECERS, ITERS and FCERS assessments with participants enrolled in the program. There are 8 providers in the La Paz/Mohave Region: 3 in Kingman, 4 in Bullhead City and 1 in Mohave Valley (see provider list below). There are also 2 Quality First providers in the Colorado River Indian Tribe (CRIT) region in Parker and 1 provider in the Hualapai region in Peach Springs.
- 2. **Child Care Health Consultation** Child care health consultants are nurses, or other trained public health professionals, who assist child care facilities to address health and safety issues common in their setting. Child health consultation is an incentive built in to the Quality First model. Negotiations are underway with the Mohave County Health Departments to provide a .25 FTE to serve La Paz and Mohave County Quality First participants. This consultant will serve the 11 providers participating in Quality First in the La Paz/Mohave, CRIT and Hualapai regions.
- 3. **TEACH scholarships** First Things First and the Association for Supportive Child Care, The TEACH administrative home, have created procedures to assist Quality First coaches as they conduct the initial orientations and explain the availability of the scholarships to staff. TEACH scholarships are an incentive offered to Quality First participants. A TEACH information session for Quality First participants in our region took place Saturday, July 18<sup>th</sup> in Bullhead City. The first scholarship applications for Quality First enrolled program staff are currently being completed and the T.E.A.C.H. contract with the Association for Supportive Child Care is being amended to add include our 40 regionally funded TEACH scholarships.
- 4. Mental Health Consultation- The scope of work is being completed for this statewide initiative. This strategy was designed to set up an administrative home as an infrastructure for delivery of infant toddler mental health consultation services. The administrative home will assist healthcare professionals in getting the appropriate credentials to provide mental health consultation to children 0-5 years of age via tuition reimbursements. There are additional components to provide continuing education opportunities and assist regions in offering financial incentives to recruit qualified professionals to specific communities. Currently, this document has been sent out for vetting to other First Things First staff, including regional team members, for comments and is expected to be completed by the end of the month.
