FTF Needs and Assets Reports Scope of Work

- Reports are to provide a snapshot of
 - the characteristics of the region's children under six and their families
 - the assets available to children and families
 - the unmet needs of these children and families
- Examine six goal areas primarily thru the collection and analysis of available data
 - 1) quality and access to early care and education
 - 2) health
 - 3) professional development of early care teachers and workers
 - 4) family support
 - 5) public information on awareness of early childhood issues
 - 6) coordination among early childhood programs and services

Goals

- To understand and convey the particular character of the Yavapai Region and its families and children
- To identify community needs and to recognize and document the considerable strengths of the communities in the Yavapai Region that can be leveraged to meet those needs
- To identify, in partnership with the Yavapai Regional Council, relevant and “actionable” recommendations based on the information gained

Additional Work Products

- Matrices of community-level indicators
 - Identify and define appropriate geographic analysis areas within the Yavapai region
 - Identify appropriate and accessible indicators to be collected for each community
- Web-based data querying system
 - Allowing display and comparison of indicators by geographical area

Review of Draft Community Indicators and Potential Geographies

Potential Community Indicators

Population characteristics

- Number of children 0-5
- Number of families with children 0-5
- Racial/ethnic group, immigrant or tribal status
- Family composition (e.g., single parent, grandparent led family, etc.)
- Language usage

Economic Circumstances

- Median income
- Number and/or percent of children zero through five and/or families with children zero through five (or families with children 1-18) living at 50%, 100%, 150%, and 200% of the federal poverty level
- Employment and unemployment data
- Other economic indicators (e.g., unemployment insurance, TANF)
- Data about food security and childhood hunger (e.g., SNAP, use of food banks)
- Number of children in free or reduced lunch program

Educational Indicators

- Data on the educational attainment of parents,
- Standardized test scores by school district
- Data about homeschooling
- Data on literacy and kindergarten readiness (assessments school by school basis)

Quality and Access

- Number of accredited early care and education centers/homes
- Number of early care and education programs
- Cost of early care and education to families


Health

- Health insurance coverage
- Healthy births (prenatal care, low birth weight, preterm births, teen births)
- Oral health
- Immunizations
- Infant and child mortality and morbidity

Family Support


- Child abuse/neglect, foster care
- Juvenile justice involvement

Legislative Districts




5 current legislative districts





AIRC: Legislative Grid Map Option 1




AIRC: Legislative Grid Map Option 2
