### **WHAT IS THE CENTRAL PHOENIX REGIONAL PARTNERSHIP COUNCIL GRANT PROGRAM TO TARGET FAMILIES IN CRISIS?**

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The Central Phoenix Regional Partnership Council (RPC) has identified the need for regional implementation to expand the capacity of programs that assist families that are in crisis or at high risk of crisis. The Central Phoenix Regional Council seeks applications from existing organizations that serve at-risk families in the region or neighboring communities. Efforts should be aimed at strengthening families at-risk for abuse or neglect who have not been involved with Child Protective Services. Types of services or programs may include respite or emergency shelter services for children, counseling services, addressing issues such as behavioral difficulties, anger management, abuse and neglect, divorce/changing families, anxiety or depression, and family support services aimed to strengthening skills that help families cope with stressors, such as managing a family's finances or finding a job.

### **WHAT IS THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF FUNDING AVAILABLE?**

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Approximately \$500,000 is available in this Request for Grant Application. Contract renewal will be contingent upon satisfactory contract performance, evaluation and availability of funds.

The anticipated contract period for any resultant grant will be September 1, 2009 - to June 30, 2010.
