The target population for this strategy is universal, reaching out to all children birth through five in the Central Maricopa and Southeast Maricopa regions.

Community-based Parent Education will target up to 3150 (1400 Central Maricopa, 1750 Southeast Maricopa) families with children birth through five in the Central and Southeast Maricopa regions irrespective of income levels. Although a universal strategy targeting all families, the Regional Councils have included in this strategy the intent to reach high risk populations including pregnant and parenting teens, as well as grandparents raising grandchildren, through this strategy.
