









Time to make a commitment to cultural responsivity – Do it!

- Educators must make a commitment to combat prejudice, discrimination, and racism.


Time to make a commitment to cultural responsivity – Value it!

- Educators must have reverence for the earth


Time to make a commitment to cultural responsivity – Believe it!




What are the Benefits of Culturally Responsivity?

- Build on students' cultural strengths




How do You Become Culturally Responsive?

- Enjoy the journey






What is Culture?
