Action Item: Contract Eligibility for Renewal- Family Support Coordination

Background:

At the January 29 meeting, the council had an opportunity to review a list of contracts that are eligible to receive a renewal application to continue service delivery for FY15. Not included in this list to the council were the seven contracts under the Family Support Coordination strategy. In a review of the original RFGA, FTF staff found that the RGFA does allow that these grants be eligible for renewal for SFY15.

The Family Support Coordination Strategy is a unique strategy, which was awarded to implement services in two phases. The initial Planning Phase began in Year 1, January-June 2012. This phase was later extended into SFY2013 for the period July-September 2012.

The second Phase, Implementation, began October 2012-June 30 2013- (Year 2). As stated in the RFGA and documents submitted to and approved by Regional Council and First Things First State Board, contract renewal terms for the seven contracts awarded under the Family Support Coordination included an option for renewal for two additional twelve month periods. These potential renewal terms are as such:

- July 1, 2013-June 30, 2014 (year 3)
- July 1, 2014- June 30, 2015 (year 4)

The contracts under this strategy are currently in their third contract year; second year of program implementation.

Council discussions regarding program performance related to the seven contracts under the Family Support Coordination strategy have occurred, particular to the council's request for further information related to service units which lagged behind the Contracted Service Number. During funding planning discussions, the council reinstated the priority to include the Family Support Coordination strategy in the SFY15 Funding plan. Service units and performance were being addressed by grantees in cooperation with FTF staff. Also, there was information presented by FTF staff that the contracts in place were not eligible for renewal, and a new RFGA would be necessary and offered for implementation of the strategy for SFY15 (July 2014- June 30, 2015).

At this point, the council has several considerations and can consider the intent of the strategy and discuss the following considerations to strategy implementation for SFY15.

Council Considerations:

Council may direct staff to send a renewal application to the contracts listed under the Family Support Coordination strategy as indicated in attachment 1.

Council may direct staff not to send a renewal application to the contracts listed under the Family Support Coordination strategy as indicated in attachment 1.

Council may direct staff to implement strategy through a Request for Grant Application (RFGA) for SFY15.
