Call to Order/Welcome/Introductions

A Regular Meeting of the First Things First Tohono O'odham Nation Regional Partnership Council took place on February 7, 2015 at the San Simon Elementary School Library, San Simon, Arizona 85634. Chair Mildred Manuel welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 10:06 a.m.

Members Present: Ella Begay, Kymberlii Tenario, Jeanne Leon, Cheryl Conde, and Mildred Manuel

Members Present telephonically: Dr. Albert Adler

Members Absent: Joseph Mease and Rose Lopez

Invocation

Member Ella Begay provided the invocation.

Approval of November 15, 2014 Tohono O'odham Nation Regional Partnership Council Meeting Minutes

A motion was made by member Adler that the Tohono O'odham Nation Regional Partnership Council approve the minutes of the November 15, 2014 Regional Council meeting as presented, seconded by member Conde. Motion carried.

Call to the Public

None at this time.

Community Outreach Update and Discussion

Chair Manuel turned the floor over to Community Outreach Coordinator Aggie Hart, who went over her reports from December and January, highlighting events such as the Christmas event, which she thought was excellent. She spoke of meeting the families there and the impacts you could see happening thanks to the work of the Regional Council. Ms. Hart spoke about successfully getting on KOHN, the radio station on the Tohono O'odham Nation. She also explained the pilot program for the parent kits in Pima County, and asked members to pass along the order form to anyone providing services to families. Ms. Hart spoke about an upcoming site tour of a head start and informed the members she would let them know as soon as a date was set. Chair Manuel suggested also setting up a site tour for Baboquivari Unified School District.

Discussion and Possible Action: Tohono O'odham Nation Regional Partnership Council Grant Agreement GRA-RC026-14-0674-01 Quality First Child Care Scholarships with the Tohono O'odham Nation

Chair Manuel introduced the item and turned the floor over to Travis Le Duc, Regional Director, who provided the members with an update that First Things First Chief Executive Officer Sam Leyvas sent a letter requesting an update on the status of the grants and are waiting on a response. He added that at this time he does not have an update from the Education Department Liaison, Director Hobbs. Mr. Le Duc states that it is unlikely at this point for this grant to be deliverable this fiscal year (Fiscal Year 2015). He stated that it is best to focus on Fiscal Year 2016 and that Director of Fiscal Operations Russell Spencer is working with Travis to enable a smooth set up of Fiscal Year 2016. Members had questions about the timeline of events, such as when the letter went out to the Chairman and requested a copy of the letter. Mr. Le Duc stated he would be happy to provide the letter to them and addressed their questions. Member Adler wanted to state that "We need to be mindful of spending of our dollars, especially as a large amount of funds were recently removed from the fund balance largely because of this unspent (line item)" and added that she is "deeply disturbed by this."

Discussion and Possible Action: Tohono O'odham Nation Regional Partnership Council Grant Agreement GRA-RC026-14-0674-01 Quality First Child Care Scholarships with the Tohono O'odham Nation

Chair Manuel introduced the agenda item and turned the floor over to Mr. Le Duc, who stated that this grant agreement is being particularly focused on as there is an opportunity to extend the contract beyond this fiscal year based on the funding plan for Fiscal Year 2016. Members had questions about the planning department and if they were invited to attend or could be invited to a future

meeting to speak about the contract. Mr. Le Duc answered in the affirmative to both questions, and added that he would keep the Regional Council informed of any progress made between now and the next meeting.

Discussion and Possible Action on 2014 Tohono O’odham Nation Regional Partnership Council Needs and Assets Report

Chair Manuel turned the floor over to Violetta Dominguez of the University of Arizona Norton School. Ms. Dominguez thanked the members for the opportunity to present to them and gave an overview of the process, highlighting specific pieces of data and addressing the known challenges of Census data with Tribal populations. Members had a few questions regarding data, charts and tables, which Ms. Dominguez addressed. Chair Manuel pointed out an omission of the new district in the Executive Summary, though it had been included elsewhere. Ms. Dominguez thanked her and asked members for any more corrections or questions.

A motion was made by Vice Chair Tenario that the Regional Council accept the Needs and Assets Report with the edits made, and that once it is sent to the Education Department Liaison she has four weeks to review it; seconded by member Conde. Motion carried.

Regional Director’s Report

Mr. Le Duc went over the expenditure report and thanked partners for being willing partners. He thanked Dr. Morris for her work with Child Care scholarships. Mr. Le Duc then went over the data report and highlighted the professional development data; he also provided updates about the Narrative Report, speaking about the Parent Advocates work and their Ages and Stages Questionnaire ASQ tool. Chair Manuel stated she was glad they had found a screening tool and stated the importance of the tool and curriculum for sustainability of the program. Mr. Le Duc added that with the change in type of program to Family Support Coordination, the advocates will be able to better track the referrals they are making and better highlight the work they are already doing. He also informed the Regional Council of a Right Way Training Community Outreach Coordinator Aggie Hart is conducting Monday February 12th on Tohono O’odham Nation.

Recommended Future Agenda Items

Members determined their next meeting would be March 7th at 1:00 pm, and member Conde will look into a room in San Xavier. Mr. Le Duc asked the members for other agenda items in addition to information about Ages and Stages, the Planning Department, and a site visit of a Tohono O’odham Nation early care and education center. Chair Manuel asked to add a tour in the future of the Baboquivari classrooms as well.

Mr. Le Duc added that he had forgot to mention a point seen on attachment #4, namely that Vice Chair Tenario was asked to participate in the committee, had accepted and would be representing all five regions on that committee. He thanked her. He announced that the Cross-Regional Meeting will be held March 3rd, and that CEO Sam Leyvas will most likely be in attendance to give an update.

Call to the Public

Sara Mae Williams, Baboquivari Unified School District Board Member- Ms. Williams stated that BUSD has an opportunity to open another pre-k classroom and would submit a proposal to utilize some of the funds that are going to go unexpended. She stated they currently have 4 classrooms, for a total of about 80 students, and that BUSD was thinking of adding one to the Baboquivari High School to serve the students who are also parents of young children at the school. Members asked Mr. Le Duc if that was an option, and he stated he would work with BUSD and if possible put the BUSD presentation on the next agenda.

Adjourn

Chair Manuel adjourned the meeting at approximately 11:44 p.m.
