

Regional PRN CCHC

The PRN CCHC will provide CCHC services to region(s) with an open CCHC position. This Contracted position may be filled by more than one CCHC to address need. It is possible that a PRN CCHC may provide services in more than one region at a time. The regional need for the PRN position will be assessed quarterly. All CCHC contract requirements apply to this position.

- I. The CCHC will have at least 6 months experience as a CCHC
- II. Travel to the region(s) identified by the CCHC program Manager and Maricopa County.
- III. The CCHC will travel to all areas in the State; knowing it will require extended overnight stays for up to a week at a time.
 - a. 80% of position is to provide direct CCHC services to contracted centers and homes in the region.
 - b. 20% of the position will be spent on recruitment of a regional CCHC.
- IV. The CCHC will work with the FTF regional director, grantee if applicable and key informants in the region to identify a qualified applicant.
- V. The CCHC program Manager will assist as needed with identifying and contacting key regional informants. Once the regional CCHC position is filled, the PRN CCHC will assist in successful program delivery by mentoring the regional CCHC for 1-2 months as a supportive mentor.

Formula for funding is based on the

- Number of TSU's
- 15% frontier cost
- Regional council choice to spend current unawarded CCHC



Child Care Health Consultation

Child Care Health Consultants (CCHC) are Nurses and Master prepared health professionals who have completed the National Training Institute, Chapel Hill NC, CCHC training program. Child Care Health Consultants support Child Care Providers and the families they serve by guiding and assisting caregivers in the management of health and safety in the child care environment.

Consultation is a collaborative, problem-solving process between an external consultant with specific expertise and adult learning knowledge and skills and an individual or group from one program or organization. Consultation facilitates the assessment and resolution of an issue-specific concern—a program-/organizational-, staff-, or child-/family-related issue—or addresses a specific topic.

Program Delivery

CCHC services are available to all Quality First programs in a flexible 3 tiered collaborative model of consultation. Upon enrollment a CCHC will be assigned to your program to visit with you and review the 3 tier service levels. As a collaborative group the CCHC, coach and you will decide which tier level meets your current need(s).

** Please note this is a flexible system and you may move between tier service levels at any time. Contact the Birth to Five helpline, your coach or CCHC to request a change in tier level service.

Tier Service levels

Tier One: Telephonic guidance -*Birth to Five Help line--1-877-705-KIDS(5437)*

A provider may use this service when seeking training opportunities or have identified a need for a resource. In example, a resource to refer a parent for insurance.

Tier Two: Short term need- *Issue that requires (1-4 visits) In example: a new medical diagnosis; such as diabetes.*

Tier Three: Comprehensive CCHC services

CCHC work with the provider on identified needs by completing a California Assessment, reviewing results and develop of a plan to reach desired goals for health and safety. The program is designed for free movement of a provider between tier service levels to respond to the current need of the provider. Please see diagram below.


