Arizona Early Childhood Development & Health Board White Mountain Apache Tribe Regional Partnership Council *DRAFT Meeting Minutes*

A Regular Council Meeting open to the public, was held on Monday, June 2, 2014 beginning at 3:00 p.m. The meeting was held at ABC Day Care, 422 South 2nd Avenue, Whiteriver, Arizona 85941.

Welcome/Introduction/Call to Order

Chair Endfield called the meeting to order at 3:02 p.m. She asked the members and public present to introduce their self. Members present were Chair Endfield, Vice Chair Whitesinger, Shine Burnette, Velma Kaytoggy and Kathy Wynn. Members present telephonically were Jandi Hernandez, Mike Gaffney and Nikina Whitaker. Member absent was Ranelda Hastings. Chair Endfield asked that the members on the phone announce their name when speaking and voting.

Call to the Public

There were no calls to the public received.

Disclosure of Conflicts

There were no conflicts of interest disclosed at this time.

Discussion and Possible Approval of April 14, 2014 Meeting Minutes

Chair Endfield asked for a motion for the April 14, 2014 meeting minutes. Member Whitesinger moved to approve the April 14, 2014 Meeting Minutes as presented. Member Burnette seconded. Members on the phone identified their self and their vote, motion passed 7:0:1.

Presentation, Discussion and Approval of April 14, 2014 Executive Session Minutes

This agenda items was tabled until a quorum of members is present in person to review the minutes.

Discussion and Possible Approval of May 12, 2014 Special Telephonic Meeting Minutes

Chair Endfield asked for a motion for the May 12, 2014 meeting minutes. Member Whitesinger moved to approve the May 12, 2014 Meeting Minutes as presented. Member Kaytoggy seconded. Members on the phone identified their self and their vote, motion passed 8:0:0.

Presentation, Discussion and Possible Approval of Community Awareness Budget for SFY2015

Regional Director Beazley presented the budget for community awareness for SFY2015. She said that the amount has been reduced from SFY2014, which included funds for the community resource guide. There is also a reduction in the amount of books to be purchased for SFY2015. There was discussion about if the Regional Council could use local vendors. Regional Director Beazley told the members that local business could be used if they were on the State Procurement list. Member Burnette moved to approve the SFY 2015 Community Awareness Budget as presented for \$21,487.00. Member Whitesinger seconded. Members on the phone identified their self and their vote, motion passed 8:0:0.

Discussion and Election of the Regional Partnership Council Chair and Vice Chair

Chair Endfield asked for nominations or motion for Chair for SFY2015. She said that she is willing to serve another year, but would be fine if someone else would like to serve. There were no nominations, Member Burnette moved Laurel Endfield be elected as Chair of the White Mountain Apache Tribe Regional Partnership Council for SFY2015. Member Wynn seconded. Members on the phone identified their self and their vote, motion passed 7:0:1.

Chair Endfield asked for nominations or motion for Vice Chair. Member Wynn moved Dawnafe Whitesinger be elected as Vice Chair of the White Mountain Apache Tribe Regional Partnership Council for SFY2015 (*subject to appointment by the State Board*). Member Kaytoggy seconded. Member Burnette asked if there were any other nominations. Hearing none, Chair Endfield called for the vote, Members on the phone identified their self and their vote, motion passed 7:0:1.

Introduction of the Early Childhood Comprehensive System Building

Regional Director Beazley gave a brief update of the system building. She said that Karen Peifer, Sr. Director of Children's Health with FTF will be at the July 7th meeting to talk about system building. Regional Director Beazley said that in the meantime she has been contacting agencies that work with children to try to set up an initial coordination meeting to come up with a plan to coordinate among agencies for standard referral procedures. She said that she had very positive response.

Regional Director Report

Monthly Report

Regional Director Beazley provided a report of her monthly activities. She has a very busy June planned with several events and meetings.

Kat Bunker, FTF Admin, asked the Regional Council who will be attending the Regional Meeting on June 10th in Flagstaff. Sr. Director Turner gave the Regional Council an overview of the agenda for the day. Member Endfield, Whitesinger and Burnett indicated that they will be attending. Ms. Bunker also reminded the Members about the upcoming Early Childhood Summit. She asked anyone who wants to go to complete a reservation form as soon as possible.

Financial Reports

Regional Director Beazley provided the monthly financial reports. She said there are no concerns; everything is on track for quarter 3. She said that the expansion did submit for reimbursement so that will be showing up soon. There was also conversation around the Professional Reward\$ and if there will be enough funds for the demand. Sr. Director Turner suggested that be researched further and included for discussion during the strategic planning process.

FY14 Needs & Assets Report Update

Regional Director Beazley updated the Regional Council on the timeline of the Needs and Assets Report. She said the vendor is still gathering some data and clarifications of data. She should have a draft from the vendor to provide to the Regional Council about two weeks prior to the July 7, 2014 meeting. She said that the vendor will be at the July 7th meeting to give a report and answer questions. Once the Regional Council approves the draft it will go to the Health Board and then to the Tribal Council for approval.

Community Resource Guide Update

Regional Director Beazley provided a couple of copies of the rough draft of the updated Community Resource Guide for the Regional Council members to look over and provide any comments.

Future Agenda Items/Council Member Updates

Chair Endfield asked for an update of recruitment. Regional Director Beazley said that there will be two at-large seats open and said she is working to fill the Child Care Provider seat. She asked if anyone knows of anyone they would recommend, please let her know.

Goals

- Increase age appropriate developmental screening in the state
 - Align screening practices across regions
 - Reduce unnecessary duplication
 - Reduce false positives
- Expand the use of online screening tools to facilitate ease of use and consistent data collection, feedback and analysis
- Provide PD opportunities to support skills on the use of screening and assessment data

 - #/% of children identified with a developmental delay in kindergarten

Opportunity Assessment: Key Findings

- The intervening early system within the state is fragmented.
- Place matters- areas of poverty, access to services, disparities.
- AzEIP (Part C) is just one program among many that serves young children.
- Medical system (Clinical care and health insurance) are key drivers in identifying children with developmental delays.
- There needs to be a more efficient method for screening children.
 - AZ has a lower % of children being screened and receiving services compared to the national average.



ECCS Grant Goal

“Coordination of the expansion of developmental screening activities in early care and education settings statewide by connecting pediatric and other child health leaders with child care health consultants to link training and referrals among medical homes, early intervention services, child care programs and families.”



ECCS Priorities

- Family engagement through forums.
- “Close the feedback loop” between those conducting screening and those receiving referrals.
- Develop and implement a common screening tool and referral process.
- Integrated data system
- Clinical support and behavior change



Regional Demonstration Projects (ECCS link)

- Develop and inventory of community resources that include FTF and non-FTF funded organizations
- Connect everyone who screens children across settings into a unified system.
- Improve screening and referrals across system partners: early childhood education, home visitation programs, medical homes/clinics and early intervention programs.
- Improve communication.



Regional Demonstration Projects

(ECCS link)

- Meet with regional directors and regional councils by August 2014
 - Use of common screening tool: ASQ
 - Develop policy and protocols for use of online system
 - Develop a planning process to convene local partners



Regional Demonstration Projects (ECCS link)

- Ask for local input and commitment to participate.
- At the same time, identify similarities and differences in the screening process used in tribal regions.
- Co-develop a plan with progress measures and expected outcomes at regional level.
- Start implementation by September 2014.

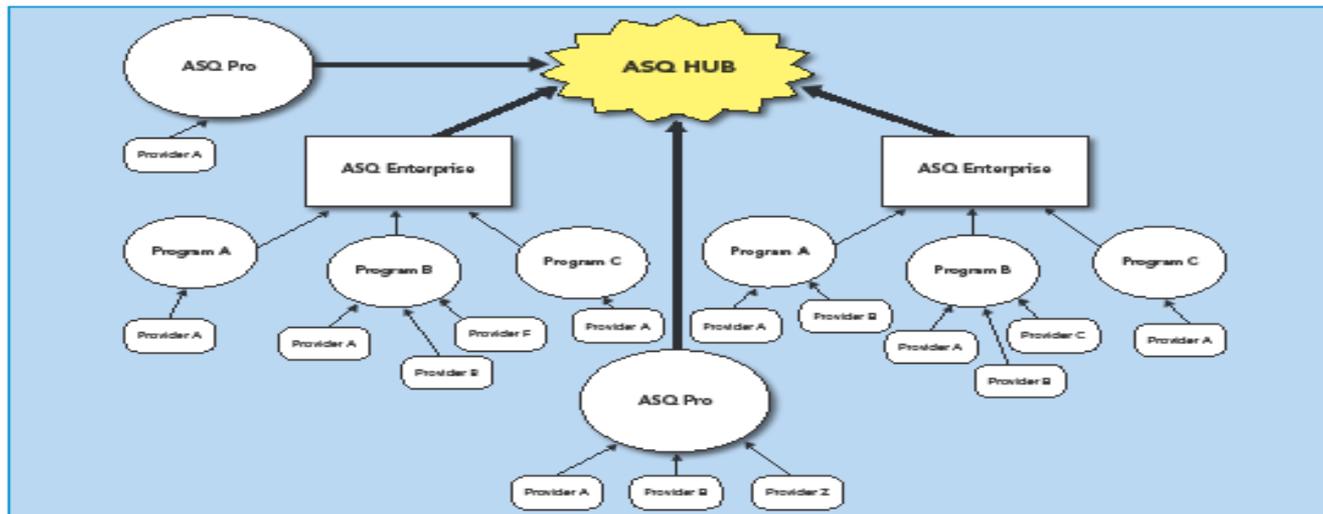

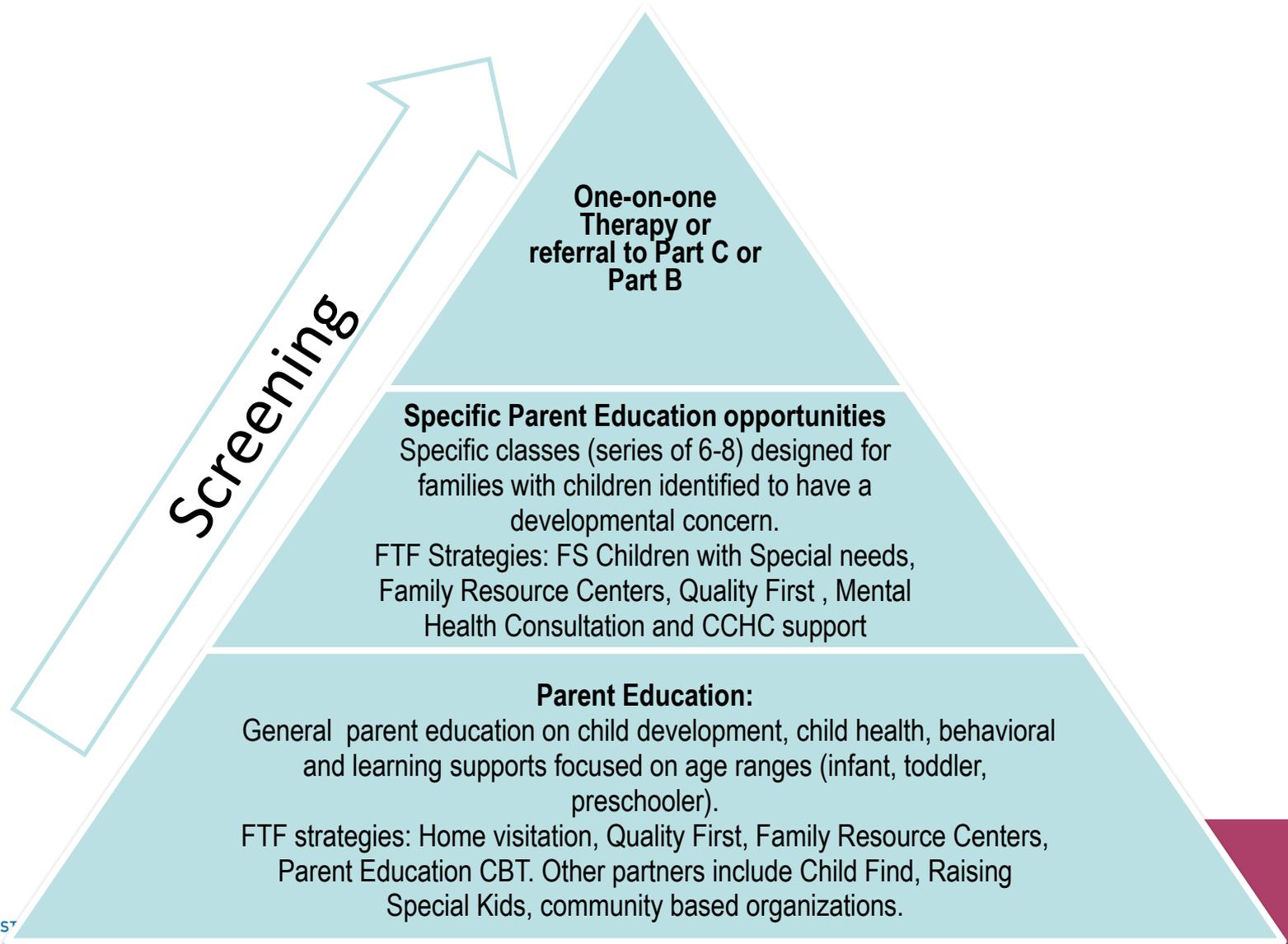

Proposal: Navajo/Apache Region Community Outreach Staff collaboration with White Mountain Apache Tribal Region

- This is an offer of Community Outreach staff support from Navajo/Apache Regional Partnership Council to the White Mountain Apache Tribe Regional Partnership Council and staff. This support will be funded by the Navajo/Apache Region (Nav/Apa). This collaboration would be a positive asset to both regions as it would allow for the expansion First Things First awareness and engagement efforts in these closely-connected regions.
- The work of this agreement would commence immediately following approval of proposal.
- The Community Outreach collaboration between Nav/Apa and White Mountain Apache Tribal (WMAT) regions would include, but not be limited to:
 - The WMAT Regional Director and the Nav/Apa Outreach Coordinator may deliver co-presentations when appropriate, with the outreach coordinator focusing on the First Things First basic outreach presentation and the Regional Director providing region-specific, localized information. The WMAT Regional Director and the Nav/Apa Outreach Coordinator may collaborate at community events when necessary and appropriate (i.e. WMAT volunteer is not available)
 - To maximize the resources of the Community Outreach Coordinator, every effort will be made to work with, and support the work of, the WMAT Regional Director in the Lakeside Office
 - The Nav/Apa Community Outreach Coordinator will travel with the WMAT Regional Director at all times to preclude travel cost to Nav/Apa Region, and will not work in the WMAT Region without being accompanied by the WMAT Regional Director
 - The Outreach Coordinator will regularly update, and train if needed, WMAT Regional Director with new and relevant procedures, tools and messaging for FTF Community Outreach
 - The Outreach Coordinator will train WMAT Regional Director, Regional Partnership Council members, grantees and community volunteers with current Speaker's Bureau Training (Early Childhood Every Day and The Write Way), as well as how to set up an First Things First outreach table, what messages to share with the general public, and other tools/tactics.
 - The Outreach Coordinator will provide WMAT Regional Director, Regional Partnership Council members, community partners with the support and Community Outreach tools/collateral pieces for outreach events/presentations
 - The WMAT Regional Director will enter WMAT Regional Friends, Supporters and Champions in the FTF data tracking system.
- The projected division of work for the Outreach Coordinator will be 5 hours per week or 20 hours per month of work in the WMAT region with the remainder delegated to Navajo/Apache region work.
- To coordinate this cross-regional work, twice monthly 1:1 meetings will be held for planning, coordinating and updating the WMAT Regional Director on current Community Outreach tools and training, and, when appropriate, will include the Nav/Apa Regional Director.
- The WMAT Regional Director will create and deliver regular reports to the WMAT Regional Partnership Council on the progress of Community Outreach and Awareness efforts.
- Navajo/Apache Community Outreach Coordinator will make an annual review to WMAT Regional Partnership Council for the purpose of providing information on work done, and receiving feedback from the council.
