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### **Arizona Early Childhood Development & Health Board White Mountain Apache Tribe Regional Partnership Council *DRAFT Meeting Minutes***

A Regular Council Meeting open to the public, was held on Monday, June 2, 2014 beginning at 3:00 p.m. The meeting was held at ABC Day Care, 422 South 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, Whiteriver, Arizona 85941.

#### **Welcome/Introduction/Call to Order**

Chair Endfield called the meeting to order at 3:02 p.m. She asked the members and public present to introduce their self. Members present were Chair Endfield, Vice Chair Whitesinger, Shine Burnette, Velma Kaytoggy and Kathy Wynn. Members present telephonically were Jandi Hernandez, Mike Gaffney and Nikina Whitaker. Member absent was Ranelda Hastings. Chair Endfield asked that the members on the phone announce their name when speaking and voting.

#### **Call to the Public**

There were no calls to the public received.

#### **Disclosure of Conflicts**

There were no conflicts of interest disclosed at this time.

#### **Discussion and Possible Approval of April 14, 2014 Meeting Minutes**

Chair Endfield asked for a motion for the April 14, 2014 meeting minutes. Member Whitesinger moved to approve the April 14, 2014 Meeting Minutes as presented. Member Burnette seconded. Members on the phone identified their self and their vote, motion passed 7:0:1.

#### **Presentation, Discussion and Approval of April 14, 2014 Executive Session Minutes**

This agenda items was tabled until a quorum of members is present in person to review the minutes.

#### **Discussion and Possible Approval of May 12, 2014 Special Telephonic Meeting Minutes**

Chair Endfield asked for a motion for the May 12, 2014 meeting minutes. Member Whitesinger moved to approve the May 12, 2014 Meeting Minutes as presented. Member Kaytoggy seconded. Members on the phone identified their self and their vote, motion passed 8:0:0.

#### **Presentation, Discussion and Possible Approval of Community Awareness Budget for SFY2015**

Regional Director Beazley presented the budget for community awareness for SFY2015. She said that the amount has been reduced from SFY2014, which included funds for the community resource guide. There is also a reduction in the amount of books to be purchased for SFY2015. There was discussion about if the Regional Council could use local vendors. Regional Director Beazley told the members that local business could be used if they were on the State Procurement list. Member Burnette moved to approve the SFY 2015 Community Awareness Budget as presented for \$21,487.00. Member Whitesinger seconded. Members on the phone identified their self and their vote, motion passed 8:0:0.

#### **Discussion and Election of the Regional Partnership Council Chair and Vice Chair**

Chair Endfield asked for nominations or motion for Chair for SFY2015. She said that she is willing to serve another year, but would be fine if someone else would like to serve. There were no nominations, Member Burnette moved Laurel Endfield be elected as Chair of the White Mountain Apache Tribe Regional Partnership Council for SFY2015. Member Wynn seconded. Members on the phone identified their self and their vote, motion passed 7:0:1.

Chair Endfield asked for nominations or motion for Vice Chair. Member Wynn moved Dawnafe Whitesinger be elected as Vice Chair of the White Mountain Apache Tribe Regional Partnership Council for SFY2015 (*subject to appointment by the State Board*). Member Kaytoggy seconded. Member Burnette asked if there were any other nominations. Hearing none, Chair Endfield called for the vote, Members on the phone identified their self and their vote, motion passed 7:0:1.

### **Introduction of the Early Childhood Comprehensive System Building**

Regional Director Beazley gave a brief update of the system building. She said that Karen Peifer, Sr. Director of Children's Health with FTF will be at the July 7<sup>th</sup> meeting to talk about system building. Regional Director Beazley said that in the meantime she has been contacting agencies that work with children to try to set up an initial coordination meeting to come up with a plan to coordinate among agencies for standard referral procedures. She said that she had very positive response.

### **Regional Director Report**

#### **Monthly Report**

Regional Director Beazley provided a report of her monthly activities. She has a very busy June planned with several events and meetings.

Kat Bunker, FTF Admin, asked the Regional Council who will be attending the Regional Meeting on June 10<sup>th</sup> in Flagstaff. Sr. Director Turner gave the Regional Council an overview of the agenda for the day. Member Endfield, Whitesinger and Burnett indicated that they will be attending. Ms. Bunker also reminded the Members about the upcoming Early Childhood Summit. She asked anyone who wants to go to complete a reservation form as soon as possible.

### **Financial Reports**

Regional Director Beazley provided the monthly financial reports. She said there are no concerns; everything is on track for quarter 3. She said that the expansion did submit for reimbursement so that will be showing up soon. There was also conversation around the Professional Reward\$ and if there will be enough funds for the demand. Sr. Director Turner suggested that be researched further and included for discussion during the strategic planning process.

### **FY14 Needs & Assets Report Update**

Regional Director Beazley updated the Regional Council on the timeline of the Needs and Assets Report. She said the vendor is still gathering some data and clarifications of data. She should have a draft from the vendor to provide to the Regional Council about two weeks prior to the July 7, 2014 meeting. She said that the vendor will be at the July 7<sup>th</sup> meeting to give a report and answer questions. Once the Regional Council approves the draft it will go to the Health Board and then to the Tribal Council for approval.

### **Community Resource Guide Update**

Regional Director Beazley provided a couple of copies of the rough draft of the updated Community Resource Guide for the Regional Council members to look over and provide any comments.

### **Future Agenda Items/Council Member Updates**

Chair Endfield asked for an update of recruitment. Regional Director Beazley said that there will be two at-large seats open and said she is working to fill the Child Care Provider seat. She asked if anyone knows of anyone they would recommend, please let her know.

#### ***DRAFT Meeting Minutes***

A Special Meeting of the White Mountain Apache Tribe Regional Partnership Council was held on Friday, July 18, 2014 beginning at 10:00 a.m. Members of the Regional Partnership Council attended telephonically. The meeting was open to the public at the First Things First Lakeside Office, 4700 W. White Mountain Blvd., Lakeside, Arizona, 85929.

#### **Welcome/Introduction/Call to Order**

Chair Endfield called the meeting to order at 10:16 a.m. Ms. Endfield asked for a roll call of members present and asked that Regional Council members identify themselves before speaking or voting for the benefit of the minutes and members of the public. Members present were Chair Endfield, Dawnafe Whitesinger, Kathy Wynn, Jandi Craig, Mike Gaffney, and Paula Hoyt. Absent were Members Shine Burnette and Nikina Whitaker.

#### **Disclosure of Conflicts**

Chair Endfield asked if there were any conflicts of interest. No conflicts were disclosed at this time.

#### **Presentation, Discussion and Possible Approval of the Extension of the Expansion: Increase slots and/or Capital Expense Strategy**

Regional Director Beazley presented information to the Regional Council about the Expansion: Increase slots and/or Capital Expense Strategy. She noted this portion of the strategy was intended to be completed during the last half of SFY2014. This did not occur as the center has not yet received a Quality First Star Rating. The strategy will need to be extended for the first 6 months of SFY2015 in order for them to receive a star rating and receive funds from Quality First Scholarship funding line item in the amount of \$40,000 to continue operating. She said that starting in January the center will begin using approximately 15 full time scholarships. There was no discussion, Member Wynn moved to approve the extension of the Expansion: Increase Slots and/or Capital Expense strategy for White River School District beginning July 1 through December 31, 2014 in State Fiscal Year 2015. Member Whitesinger seconded, there was a roll call of votes, motion passed.

#### **Presentation, Discussion and Possible Approval of Cross Regional WMAT and Navajo/Apache Regional Partnership Council Community Outreach Program**

Regional Director Beazley presented an agreement provided by the Navajo/Apache Regional Partnership Council to provide assistance to Regional Director Beazley for Community Outreach, specifically for access to software and updated Community Outreach information, and assistance with outreach programs and training needs. The Community Outreach Coordinator for Navajo/Apache Regional Partnership Council will provide this assistance for up to 5 hours per week or 20 hours per month. She will provide an annual report to the Regional Council to provide information on the work that was done, and for the Regional Partnership Council to provide feedback. Senior Regional Director Turner added that this agreement has been presented to the Navajo/Apache Regional Partnership Council. There was no discussion, Chair Endfield asked for a motion, Member Wynn moved to approve the Cross Regional Community Outreach agreement between the White Mountain Apache Tribe and Navajo/Apache Regional Partnership Councils. Member Hoyt seconded, there was a roll call of votes, motion passed.

#### **Next Meeting August 4, 2014 at 3:00pm ABC Day Care Center, 422 South 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, Whiteriver, Arizona 85941**

Regional Director Beazley asked Kathy Bunker, FTF Admin to provide a few updates. Ms. Bunker asked the Regional Council Members to be looking for confirmation from the Sheraton of their room reservations. Several members said they had already received confirmations. Ms. Bunker asked the Members to let her know if they do not receive them. Ms. Bunker informed the Regional Council Members that the FTF Lakeside Office is having an Open House on Friday, August 8<sup>th</sup> from 3 – 6 p.m. All are invited.

## REACH OUT & READ

- **Parent Nutrition/Literacy Workshops** Training was held twice at these locations, Whiteriver, Cibecue and McNary Head Start and distributed 110 books in total and shared information with parents about the importance of reading aloud.
- **Parent/Teacher Conference** Twice in Cibecue spoke with parents and children about the importance of reading aloud together and distributed 228 books in total.
- **Head Start Staff Presentation** In Whiteriver we spoke with 15 Head Start teachers about strategies for advancing the early literacy development for young children, birth through age 5, and distributed 15 books. Training evaluation results indicated the training was very well received.
- **FACE Parent Presentation** In Cedar Creek we spoke with 25 parents about the critical importance of early literacy skill development and distributed 25 books.

## ORAL HEALTH

Navajo County Public Health has exceeded the contracted number of fluoride varnish applications for this quarter to reach their contract service numbers. The contract amount is 900 and provided a total of 211 fluoride applications during the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter. This amount plus the 285 applications from the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter and 298 from the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter is a total of 794 fluoride varnish applications. NCPHSD has provided a total of 9 training sessions in the past 9 months that were attended by 393 adults.

## FAMILY SUPPORT – CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

In this quarter a continued collaboration is occurring with WMAT Child Find, Northland Therapy (AZEIP), Whiteriver Unified School District, Head Start, Raising Special Kids and the Whiteriver Hospital Healthcare Providers. Communications was extended to the clinical care coordinators from the Hospital Healthcare providers in WR & CBQ resulting in an understanding that children who score low on the ASQ will be referred to the Parent Coaching Program. The WMAT Child Find program has been contacted and a Parent Coaching nurse has visited their site during ASQ screenings in March and information relating to the Parent Coaching Program and the ASQ has been provided to key staff at ABC Daycare. In addition the increase to the Parent Coaching staff has improved communication, education and various referrals from the contact that has been made with organizations resulting increase numbers of families being served.
